LIBBY SEARLE

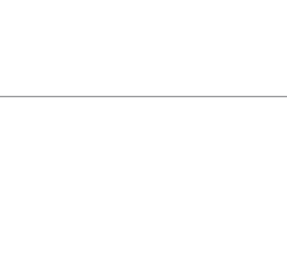
Deputy Head Pastoral

KATIE DEXTER

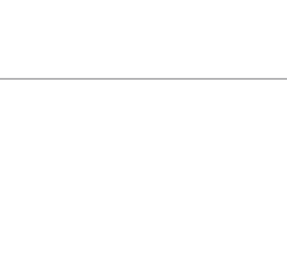
Assistant Head Pastoral
